How to vote:

There is no need to pre-register to vote as the registration of all electors for this election will take place at the time of voting. In order to register at the time of voting, you will be required complete the poll book available at the voting place and to make a declaration that you meet the requirements to be registered as set out below:

RESIDENT ELECTORS:

To register as a resident elector you must:

- be 18 years of age or older on general voting day [October 15];
- be a Canadian citizen;
- be a resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration (at time of voting);
- be a resident of the electoral area on the day of registration (at time of voting); and
- not be disgualified under the Local Government Act or any other enactment from voting in an election or assent voting and not otherwise disqualified by law.

You will need to provide:

at least two (2) documents that provide evidence of your identity and place of residence, at least one (1) of which must contain your signature. The following classes of documents will be accepted:

- a) Status card;
 - b) a Driver's Licence;
 - c) an Identification Card such as:
 - a photo BC services card; i.
 - a non-photo BC services card; ii.
 - d) an Owner's Certificate of Insurance and Vehicle Licence issued by ICBC
 - e) a BC CareCard or BC Gold CareCard;
 - f) a Ministry of Social Development and Economic Security Request for Continued Assistance Form SDES8, (now "Monthly Form EA181);
 - g) a Social Insurance Number card;
 - h) a Citizenship Card;
 - i) a real property tax notice;
 - i) a credit card or debit card; or
 - k) a utility bill, (such as electricity, natural gas, water, telephone or cable services).

The above listed identification documents MUST be accepted by election officials. An election official may also accept other forms of documents that provide evidence satisfactory to the election official (e.g., a valid, current passport).
