

Plateau Fire—South Information Bulletin

Shared amongst the Plateau Fire - South and Kleena Kleen fires are 427 personnel, 9 available helicopters, a Command Team, 29 pieces of heavy equipment, and support staff.

The south flank runs approximately 125 kilometres from Arc Mountain to Webster Creek. Updated mapping has the fire size at 519,915 hectares (5199 km²) and the perimeter length of the fire is 823.3 km long.

The wet and cold weather has decreased fire behaviour and allowed crews to make good progress. Some of the terms that will be common in the next few days/weeks are:

Mop-up—The act of extinguishing a fire after it has been brought **under control**.

- Patrol—(1) To inspect a section of a control line or portion of the fire perimeter to prevent escape of the fire.
 - (2) To travel a given route to inspect, prevent, detect, and suppress fires.

Demob—The act of removing (Demobilization) from the fireline equipment and crews that can be utilized elsewhere on a fire, or removed from a fire due to decreased need.

South East Division (C10784)

Location: South of Palmer Lake Area

Resources: 121 firefighters, 17 pieces of heavy equipment and air support as needed.

Status: Fire behaviour has dropped significantly due to the cooler weather. Crews are working on mopping up, patrolling and demobbing equipment when/where possible. Crews are using thermal imaging scans to locate hotspots.

South Area (formerly C50952)

Location: SW of Nazko Lake Park

Resources: 27 firefighters, heavy equipment and helicopters worked on the fire today.

Status: Crews are working on patrolling this area of the fire for hotspots. Scans have been done and crews are targeting known hot spots.

Southwest Area (formerly C50952 and C51171)

Location: Chezacut/Arc Mountain Area

Resources: 82 firefighters and heavy equipment along with helicopter support, continue to fortify control lines.

Status: Infrared scanning has been completed in many areas and crews have been working to extinguish the identified hotspots.

Precipice Fire (VA0778)

Size: 7368 (est.) 52Km E of Bella Coola.


Containment: 40% contained on areas on the eastern flank outside South Tweedsmuir Provincial Park, the area in the park is being allowed to burn as per the Park's Fire Management Plan.

Cause: Lightning

Status: This fire is not expected to grow past it's current

boundaries.

Objectives: This fire is being monitored and will be taken off the fire of note list as of Monday, September 11, 2017.



Kleena Kleene Fire (C50774)

Size: 25,557 (est.) 200 Km E of Williams Lake.

Cause: Lightning

Resources: 137 fire fighters, 7 helicopters and 18 pieces of

equipment.

Status: This fire consists of two branches, the Colwell Branch and the Kleena Kleene Branch.

Objectives: On the Colwell Branch (934) crews are continuing to do patrol and mop-up along most of the perimeter. The area around the Coleman-Flyshaker Trail continues to be an area of focus as crews continues to be an area of focus as crews continue to work in the rayine.

On the Kleena Kleene Branch (744) crews continue to solidify the northern finger. A small escape halfway up the east side of the finger was dealt with by crews.

Smoke from the Kleena Kleen fire was highly visible from the highway yesterday. Some Rank 2 was visible in slash. This fire continues to be active and crews continue to work on guards and actively work this fire.

A Notice to Airmen (NOTAM) remains in place for the area around the Kleena Kleen fire at:

We are using **VHF frequency 122.9** for traffic in the area of the fire.

Weather

Today (Monday): An upper ridge moves eastward while an upper trough starts to form offshore causing increasing cloudiness. Temperatures are forecasted to be 20oC with the abnormal trend of an early daytime high; relative humidity is forecasted to be 35%. Winds are forecasted to be southeasterly then southwesterly throughout the day blowing 15 to 25 km/hr and gusting to 40 km/hr at higher elevations. As a coldfront approaches, winds should shift to northwesterly and ease with cooler temperatures.

Tuesday: An upper trough moves across the province and then stalls, bringing variable clouds and rain showers in the South Plateau fire throughout the afternoon and evening. Winds should be light with lower relative humidity values, mid-teens for daytime temperatures and possible freezing temperatures at night.

Long Term: Minor winds, temperatures will remain seasonal, and no relative humidity issues forecasted.

Venting: No venting issues are anticipated with the limited smoke production from the fire activity.
