It will be open from 12-5 with 3 people allowed in at a time. Please follow their social distancing rules. The clinic is open to see patients, but most appointments will still be by phone unless there is a need for a physical examination. If you have an urgent medical need do not delay your visit to the clinic. The emergency department is open for emergencies as always, but restrictions remain in place for the number of people accompanying patients. An adult may chaperone a minor and for special clinical needs, an adult patient may have someone come in with them. In the ED please wear a mask and adhere to social distancing rules. Air Travel remains to be used for essential travel only at this time for Bella Coola - for staff, supplies, and essential medical appointments/transport. Air travel is not for general public travel at this time. Please respect local travel guidelines and restrict travel to essential needs only.
