#### <u>Issue/Background Summary</u>:

A callout was sent on social media, on CCRD's website, and to Outer Coast contacts to advertise this years Grant in Aid. A total of 7 applications were received from various community organizations, totalling \$24,900. The CCRD had budgeted \$10,178 for the 2022 Grant in Aid allocations.

Attached is a Summary Schedule of all applications. Individual applications are available to Directors upon request.

Pursuant to policy and as a reminder of applicant eligibility the following criteria must be kept in mind to be considered:

- 1. Have a mailing address and contact representatiave within the Central Coast Regional District;
- 2. Be non-partisan, non-denominational and not for profit OR at the approval of the CCRD Board be a well-established community group;
- 3. Provide a service to the residents within the Regional District; and
- 4. Have additional funding sources other than the CCRD (i.e. other grants, donations, membership revenue, corporate donations etc.).

All applications meet the criteria above.

#### Policy/Bylaw:

Policy F-17 – Application for Grant in Aid

S.263(1)(c) provides that corporate powers of regional districts includes the provision of assistance for the purpose of benefitting the community or any aspect of the community. The Grant in Aid program was developed as a mechanism to provide that assistance. Section 273 of the *Local Government Act* prohibits local governments from providing assistance to industrial, commercial and business undertakings.

## **Financial/Budgetary Implications:**

The Local Government Act s. 374(9) provides a maximum levy of \$0.10 per \$1,000 of assessment for granting assistance to community groups. The Regional District has committed to \$10,179 spending for the 2022 Grant in Aid year.

In 2021 the regional district apportioned a minimal administration fee (\$2,000) to the Grant in Aid service. In recent budget discussions, the apportioned administration fee has been increased to

\$15,262 in recognition of the amount of time and effort that is put into the advertising, review, assessment and reporting associated with the program.

The 2022 allocation to community groups of \$10,179 is a significant reduction due to the increase in apportioned administration. Because there was unspent surplus from the prior year, the 2021 allocation to community groups was \$18,760.

The 2022 tax levy for the Grant in Aid program is at the maximum allowed under legislation (\$25,369).

### Time Requirements – Staff and Elected Officials:

Advertising and posting, acceptance and review of applications, verify grant applicants are in compliance with policy, letters of success, payout and annual reporting, in addition to Board reporting.

# **Options for Consideration:**

- 1. Approve Option 1 allocate funds on an equally pro-rated basis.
- 2. Approve Option 2 full allocation to SHED Society for all electoral areas and half to BCVSAS due to broader scope of covering more than the Bella Coola Valley.
