Issue/Background Summary:

At the March 10, 2022 Regular Board Meeting, a late item was presented to the Board regarding the 2022 apportioned administration to Grant in Aid Service. The following was resolved:

22-03-12 M/S Directors Northeast/Schooner THAT the Board of Directors of the Central Coast Regional District direct Administration to reduce the apportioned administration costs to \$2,000 with the remainder being absorbed by the general operations budget. CARRIED

The Board also considered a late application for Grant in Aid, and pursuant to Policy F-17 which allows the Board to consider late applications at their discretion. As such the Board passed the following motion:

22-03-13 M/S Directors Bertrand/Northeast THAT the Board of Directors set aside Policy F-17 and accept the application from the Denny Island Community Development Association and that the Grand in Aid allocation be returned to Administration to recalculate and bring to the April meetingoard Meaning of the board. Below is a Summary Schedule of all applications. Individual applications are available to Directors upon request. The summary outlines the applicant name, area that the applicant will cover in the regional district, the amount the applicant is requesting, as well as a brief description of activities the applicant will undertake while utilizing CCRD Grant in Aid.

Pursuant to policy and as a reminder of applicant eligibility the following criteria must be kept in mind to be considered:

- 1. Have a mailing address and contact representative within the Central Coast Regional
- 2. Be non-partisan, non-denominational and not for profit OR at the approval of the CCRD -Board be a well-established community group;
- 3. Provide a service to the residents within the Regional District; and
- 4. Have additional funding sources other than the CCRD (i.e. other grants, donations, membership revenue, corporate donations etc.).

All applications met the criteria above, aside from the late application from the Denny Island Community Development Association which was accepted by the Board.

Policy/Bylaw:

Policy F-17 – Application for Grant in Aid (attached)

S.263(1)(c) of the Local Government Act provides that corporate powers of regional districts includes the provision of assistance for the purpose of benefitting the community or any aspect of the community. The Grant in Aid program was developed as a mechanism to provide that assistance. Section 273 of the Local Government Act prohibits local governments from providing assistance to industrial, commercial and business undertakings.

Financial/Budgetary Implications:

The Local Government Act s. 374(9) provides a maximum levy of \$0.10 per \$1,000 of assessment for granting assistance to community groups. The Regional District has committed to \$23,440 spending for the 2022 Grant in Aid year.

The 2022 tax levy for the Grant in Aid program is at the maximum allowed under legislation (\$25,369) which represents 2.8% of the total tax levy.

Options for Consideration:

- 1. Approve Grant in Aid funds allocated on an equally pro-rated basis.
- 2. Do not approve the Grant in Aid resolution and roll over funds for next year.
- Allocate the funds in any manner that expends \$23,440 or less, in total.
