A-12(d) - Centennial Pool - Children Six Years and Under

Policy: Centennial Pool Policy – Children 6 Years and Under

- 1. Children 6 years and under or as determined by a lifeguard, must be accompanied by a responsible guardian,
 - The lifeguards may determine who is an appropriate guardian.
 - Children must be kept within arm's reach of the guardian.
- 2. A lifejacket is NOT a replacement for a responsible guardian.
- 3. Staff have the right and authority to ask anyone to leave the pool facility.
- 4. Determination can be directed to Pool Manager who will make the final determination.

Definition:

A 'pull-out' is defined as when a lifeguard asks or physically removes someone from the swimming pool.

'Safety Infraction' is defined as:

- a) Poor Behaviour
- b) Guardian not staying within arm's reach of their Children
- c) Not following direction or arguing with staff
- d) Shows a lack of swimming ability for level of water depth

Implementation:

- 1. It is recommended that a guardian should not bring in more than two children 6 and under.
- 2. A lifeguard will pull-out a child if there is a safety infraction.
- 3. After first pull-out, a warning will be given to both the child and the caregiver. After second pull-out, the caregiver and all children he/she is looking after will be asked to leave.
- 4. Children who cannot swim without a lifejacket will not be allowed in the deep end without an able guardian.
- The policy will be posted in a prominent location at the pool.
- The policy and means of implementation will be made clear to all staff.
